E. I am in receipt of your letter of the 6th instant, forwarding one from Mr. Davis respecting a Bronze Propeller intended for Messrs. David Rowan & Co's Engines No.1016 (Messrs. Chas. Connell & Co's Yard No.424), and his remarks, together with those in the accompanying communication received from Messrs. Steven & Struthers, Ltd., have been carefully noted.

The matter has received consideration, and in reply I have to acquaint you that since the tensile strength of the material, as revealed by the first test piece, was only slightly less than the minimum specified by the Rules, and the elongation considerably in excess of the Rule requirements, indicating good ductility, the propeller in question will be accepted, it being observed that it has been examined and found sound.
