
Dear Sir,

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 3rd instant respecting the fee of £7.7.0 which you have been requested to collect from Messrs. Gammell, Laird & Co., for the survey of the electric generators built by the General Electric Co., Ltd., for the new s.s. "DUNEDIN STAR".

In connection with this matter, I have to explain that at the same time as these generators were in hand, similar generators for two sister ships (Messrs. Harland & Wolff Ltd. Yard Nos. 957/B) were also being dealt with at the shops.

The fee chargeable has been based on the instructions contained in Circ. 1638, viz., £3.3.0 per visit. In all, seven visits were paid by the Society's Surveyors to cover the inspection of the generators for these three vessels, making a total fee chargeable of £22.1.0, and this has been equally divided between the three ships.

No question has been raised by Messrs. Harland & Wolff Ltd., who have paid the fees chargeable against their vessels.

In these circumstances, it is thought that if you will be good enough to explain the matter to Messrs. Gemmell, Laird & Co., they will raise no further objection in settling this account.


