Dear Mr. Warlow,

We received from the Glasgow Office last April the launching form, Return 1, in respect of Messrs. Barclay, Curle's S.S.No. 608, which was stated to be building to class 100al. No name was given on the Return, and consequently the vessel could not be recorded in the Register Book.

We have received today from the Registrar General of Shipping a copy of the register of the S.S. "CITY OF STOCKHOLM", belonging to the Hall Line, Ltd., Liverpool, and on reference to the freeboard verification form received from you on the 24th ultimo we are able to identify this steamer as No. 608.

From Lloyd's Index I find that the "CITY OF STOCKHOLM" is entered as ex "FREDERICK GILBERT", and that she sailed from the Clyde on the 28th ultimo.

It is unfortunate that we do not appear to have received any information of a name having been assigned to this vessel, with a result that the steamer will be at sea for some two or three weeks before she is recorded in the Register Book.

I shall be glad if you will kindly look into the matter and let me have any remarks which you may be able to offer in explanation of the circumstances.
