Scheepswerf Gebr. van der Werf in order to witness the testing of two derricks, one to No. 1 hatchway and one to No. 2 hatchway, together with all gear attached, such as blocks, shackles, links, topping lifts and pendants and also all permanent attachments, such as smithwork, eyeplates, masthoops, etc. and states that these derricks withstood a statical load of 3,75 tons.

The test was carried out on the 29th of September, 1936.
