Dear Sirs,

With reference to your First Entry Report No. 27971 on the Steel Screw Steamer "CITY OF ADELAIDE". I shall be glad if you will kindly state whether the second deck beams are fitted $10 \times 3\frac{1}{2} \times .54$ " as indicated on your report, or $10\frac{1}{2} \times 3\frac{1}{2} \times .54$ as shewn on the approved plans; if a web frame has been fitted in the deep tank; whether nine pairs of $\frac{7}{8}$ " rivets are fitted in the edges of the plating between the frames amidships; if the rivets through frames are spaced $5\frac{1}{2}$ diameters apart in way of 36" frame spacing; what is the spacing of the rivets in the butts of the sheerstrake in the well, and also whether a hand pump has been fitted to the fore peak and if so whether it is in efficient working order.

It is noted that the vessel has proceeded to West Hartlepool to have her machinery installed, and the Society's Surveyors at that port have been advised of the work which remains to be completed, and requested to give the case their attention.
