Dear Sirs,

A. With reference to your letter of the 9th instant respecting the case of the S.S. "MUNERIC", I have to inform you that in addition to the ordinary classification fees for the hull and machinery which have been paid by the Builders, the amount chargeable to the Department of the Controller General of Merchant Shipbuilding will be, in the case of the hull, 40% of the difference between the fees chargeable as a standard vessel at 1/4 per gross ton and the ordinary classification fees, and in the case of the machinery, 50% of the difference.

In accordance with this arrangement an account has been rendered to the Controller General of Merchant Shipbuilding for the following amounts:-

For survey of Hull	£30.	0.	0.
" " " Machinery	£33.	0.	0.

These amounts have accordingly been entered on your First Entry Report and you will be good enough to see they are passed through your Rough Fee and Debit Books in the usual way.
