Dear Sirs,

I beg to acquaint you that I am informed by Mr. Wm. Robertson that he desires the survey of the S.S. "MALACHITE" to be proceeded with, with a view to her classification in the Society's Register Book, and I shall be glad if you will kindly give the case your attention.

I enclose herewith a copy of a letter dated the 15th instant addressed to the Owner, and have to inform you that provided the requirements of the Rules for vessels not built under Survey be complied with, the scantlings be verified; the Surveyor be satisfied in respect of the construction of the bulkheads, rudder, strengthening of bottom forward, provisions against panting, pillaring throughout, the construction of the forecastle, scarphing and strengthening at the break; particulars of the testing of the steel used in the construction of the vessel be furnished and found satisfactory; and a favourable report be received on completion of the survey, the vessel will be eligible to be recommended to the Committee for the Class 100A-.
