Dear Sirs,

S. I beg to inform you that I have been advised that the steamer "ATHENDALE", which vessel has been laid up in the Tyne for some time past, has now been sold to your goodselves through the agency of Messrs. Thomas Pinkney & Sons to be broken up.

The Class of this vessel, as you are no doubt aware, has been allowed to remain undisturbed in the Register Book up to the present on an undertaking which had been furnished by the late Owners that all outstanding surveys and repairs would be carried out before she proceeded to sea, and that intending purchasers would be informed of this condition.

As it appears that the vessel left the Tyne for the Clyde on the 3rd instant without this condition being complied with, the Committee, who have had the case before them at their meeting today, have had no alternative but to give instructions for the vessel's character to be expunged from the Register Book with a Red Line, indicating non-compliance with the Society's Rules.
