Dear Sirs,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your cablegram and letter of the 10th instant respecting the steamer "KONINGIN DER NEDERLANDEN", from which it is noted that you desire the vessel to proceed to Japan, where she is to be sold for breaking up purposes.

The Committee have had the case before them again to-day, and in the circumstances I have to say that they will not object to the steamer proceeding to Japan in ballast to be broken up, subject to the conditions mentioned in my letter of the 9th instant, viz:- That the overdue Boiler Survey be carried out and that she be submitted to a general examination and satisfactorily reported upon by the Society's Surveyors before she leaves Amsterdam.

I wired to you to this effect today as follows, which I now confirm, viz:

"KONINGIN NEDERLANDEN COMMITTEE AGREEABLE VESSEL PROCEEDING
"JAPAN IN BALLAST FOR BREAKING UP PROVIDED BOILER SURVEY
"HELD ALSO SATISFACTORY GENERAL EXAMINATION SOCIETYS
"SURVEYORS BEFORE LEAVING AMSTERDAM".
