
S. With reference to the classification in this Society's Register Book of the steamer "DAH FUNG", ex "Singu", which vessel it is understood has now become your property, I have to point out that the Annual Inspection of this vessel's Boilers, which became due so long ago as August, 1931, has not yet been held. Further, the Third Special Survey No. 1 became due at the end of last month.

I am now in receipt of a communication from the Society's Surveyor at your Port intimating that he has been unable to obtain any reply to enquiries which he has addressed to you regarding the overdue surveys.

The Committee have had this case before them at their meeting today, and I am directed to state that, in view of the circumstances above referred to and of the fact the Boiler Survey is now so long overdue, they regret they have had no alternative but to give instructions for the vessel's class to be expunged from the Register Book with a Red Line, indicating non-compliance with the Society's Rules.

I have to add that, in view of the withdrawal of this vessel's class, the record of the freeboard assigned by the Committee, together with the corresponding draught, will

also be withdrawn and the freeboard certificate is thereby cancelled and should be returned to this Office.
