Dear Sirs,

I was duly favoured with your letter of the 7th instant, enclosing an account and receipt in connexion with the fees paid for the survey held in April/May last by the Society's Surveyors at Calcutta on your oil tanker "SINGU", and in reply to your enquiry I beg to acquaint you that the matter to which you refer has been carefully considered and in all the circumstances it is thought that the proportion of the amount of the fee in respect of the damage on account of grounding might reasonably be taken as approximately 10 guineas, and that on account of the heavy weather damage as, say, 15 guineas.
