REPAIRS, OR EXAMINATION AS PER RULE, FOR I surveyed this vessel while lying afloat in the stream on account of a leak appearing right in the bottom of the vessel close to or on the keel plate on starboard side in No. 2 tank. It would appear that after this vessel discharged her oil cargo at this port, a leak suddenly appeared and on boarding the vessel at the request of the master I found a hole eaten right through the plating at the position shown on the sketch. As the vessel was about to sail I recommended a wooden plug to be driven in and the same to be boned in by cement mixed with molasses to give consistency see sketch. This was done to my satisfaction and the vessel sailed in ballast for Rangoon 22.9.08.
