I enclose herewith a copy of a letter which I have received from Messrs. Tinnmouth's Ltd., who recently purchased the steamer "GLADIATOR", (which was laid up at Fowey,) to be broken up at their Tees Yard.

As it was understood from the late Owners, Messrs. T. & J. Harrison, that no interim certificate was desired, the vessel's class was expunged from the Register Book with a red line. In view, however, of the reference contained in Messrs. Tinnmouth's letter to their having been in touch with you regarding the case, I shall be glad to learn whether this was so, and to receive any remarks you may have to make thereon.

I think it well to add that the Society's Surveyors at Falmouth telegraphed on the 8th instant that they have been informed by the Agents that the vessel was proceeding to the River Tees to be broken up, and enquired whether an interim certificate was necessary, but as no request had been received from the Owners, Messrs. Harrison's as were approached and/stated above, they informed the Liverpool
