CLASSIFICATION OF VESSELS LAID UP.

With reference to my letter of the 4th March 1931, enclosing a list of vessels laid up upon which a Special Survey is overdue, and the classification of which has been allowed to remain undisturbed on an undertaking from the Owner that the requirements of the survey shall be complied with before the vessel proceeds to sea, I am directed to acquaint you that intimation has been received to-day that the steamer "GLADIATOR" (No. 62936 in R.B.) is to be towed to the River Tees for breaking up.

In the circumstances, and as the Special Survey is so long overdue, the vessel's class is being expunged from the Register Book, and her name may accordingly be deleted from the List of vessels laid up under an Undertaking.

It is understood that the vessel will be leaving for the River Tees to-morrow.
