Dear Sirs,

With reference to the case of the S.S. "WILSON", Messrs. Furness Shipbuilding Co's No. 48, I have to inform you that on the 21st instant a proposal to dispense with the fore stays was approved, provided three of 3 $\frac{3}{4}$ " or two of 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " steel wire shrouds were fitted to each mast each side.

A letter has now been received from the Society's Surveyors at Middlesbrough in which they state it is understood from the Builders that fore stays in accordance with the Rule requirements will be fitted to each mast on the vessel's arrival at your port.

I shall therefore be glad if you will be good enough to give the matter the necessary attention, and on completion of the work to your satisfaction, to forward a report on Form No. 8 with a view to the classification of the vessel.
