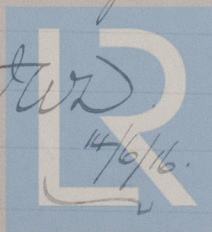
Vessel still at Nicolaieff.

On her first voyage to Batoum, at the outbreak of the war, she was detained in the Black Sea & is now still at Nicolaieff.

The Special Annual Survey of the Oil Engines became due in 7.15.
