I duly received your letter of the 14th instant enclosing a report received from Lloyd's Agent at St. Thomas V.I. relative to a survey recently held in dry dock on the barge "PEDRITO".

The Committee, who have had the case before them to-day, note that as a result of a cabled enquiry of Lloyd's Agent the Surveyors are of opinion that the requisite repairs in this case could be deferred for a period of four months, and in all the circumstances the Committee are agreeable to this arrangement, and have deferred consideration of the matter in the meantime.

I confirm my letter of the 14th instant and have to acknowledge receipt of your telegram of like date.

On receipt of your message I again took the matter of the above vessel with the two Surveyors and after discussion it thoroughly with them a reply was agreed upon, reading:-

"Radio Surveyors consider repairs can be deferred four months without undue risk" - J.F.

The Surveyors state that there was very little extra signs of wear and that, with careful navigation, they consider that the craft can be run without undue risk for a period of four months, but they state that after that period the repairs and repairs to plating must then be undertaken without fail.
