BARGE "PEDRITO".

With reference to your letter of the 7th ultimo and previous correspondence respecting the above named vessel, I have now to enclose a Report which has been received from Lloyd's Agent at St. Thomas, V.I., relative to the survey in dry dock.

It would appear from a cable since received from Lloyd's Agent that the vessel sailed on the 10th instant without effecting the recommended repairs. In the circumstances I have been in communication with the Owners with the result that I am to-day in receipt of a letter from them, which is enclosed herewith, from which you will note that they are desirous of postponing the work until the close of the Molasses Season about the end of May or the 15th June.

As a result of a cable inquiry to Lloyd's Agent, I am informed that the Surveyors are of the opinion that the necessary repairs could be deferred for a period of four months without undue risk. I shall be obliged therefore if you will be so good as to submit the matter to the Committee for their favorable consideration, and I await your reply as to the decision made.

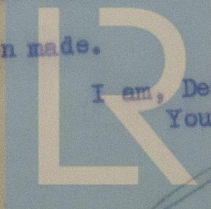
