BARGE "PIEDRITO".

I beg to refer to various letters exchange on the above subject and have to advise you that the vessel arrived here for slipping on the 24th and has since been under examination by surveyors appointed by me.

I enclose herewith a report of their examination from which you will note that fourteen plates are below requirements.

The Owners of the barge have been anxious to have the craft in service at once, without waiting for the main repairs to be done, but in view of the position taken up in your last letter, I could not see my way to agree. I, therefore, informed the Owners' Representative that, if the vessel was to retain her classification, the repairs must be effected forthwith. This information has been passed on to Owners at San Juan, P.R., and pending their decision various small repair work is going forward. Should they decide to take her back in service before completing the recommended repairs I shall pass the information to you by cable, in order that you may act accordingly.

I will keep you advised of developments.
