The test results are shown on attached sheet. After the forgings had been rough machined, they were examined, and found, so far as could be seen, sound and free from surface defects.

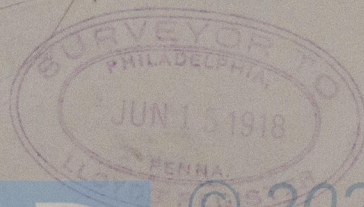
The forgings, after examination, were marked with the forge number and
