I beg to acquaint you that a report has been received from the Society's Surveyors at Liverpool, from which it appears that at the Superintendent's request, they attended on board the steamer "STAD AMSTERDAM", at Garston, and supervised repairs effected to the steering leads and after double bottom tank. The engines were also partly examined at this time, but no request was made for a survey with a view to the maintenance by this Society as provided for in the arrangements now in force for vessels formerly classed with the Germanischer Lloyd.

It is concluded that you are awaiting a convenient opportunity to submit the vessel for the requisite survey for the assignment of a record of "Examined L.B. (with date)" valid for twelve months, but I shall be glad to hear from you in due course in regard to this point.
