Case fully stated in endorsement dated 23.8.33.

On 22nd instant the Plymouth Surveyor stated he had been informed that this vessel had been sold to Italian buyers for breaking up. In reply he was informed that in the event of the sale being confirmed, and a certificate being required for the vessel to proceed to Italy with a non-perishable cargo, to be broken up, it would be necessary for him to make a general examination of the hull and machinery of the vessel in accordance with Circular No.1605, and to hold the boiler and screwshaft surveys (due July and August 1930 respectively) before the vessel sailed.

A letter has now been received from the Surveyor stating he has been informed by the Dartmouth Coaling Co. that the new Owners are procuring a certificate from the British Corporation Surveyor for this vessel to proceed to Italy for breaking up purposes.

In these circumstances it is a matter for consideration whether the vessel's class should not be expunged from the Register Book.
