The Second Special Survey No.3 became due on this vessel in July, 1932, and to complete it all Rule requirements remain to be complied with except the examination of the double bottom tank under the Boilers.

Postponements have been granted by the Classing Committee from time to time, the last one being on the 14th July last, when they agreed to an extension of the vessel's class beyond the year of grace on the definite understanding that the Special Survey would be completed on the vessel's return to Split about the first week in August, without fail, and the Boiler Survey (due 4,33) held.

In reply to enquiry the Society's Surveyor at Split now forwards a translation of a letter he has received from the Owner stating that he has decided to transfer this vessel's class to the Bureau Veritas Register as he has already three steamers classed with that Society.

In his covering letter the Surveyor states that, on stressing the advantages of retaining this Society's classification, the Owner quite agreed that it would be desirable to do so, but he feared that the Bureau Veritas might put obstacles in the way at the next survey of his other ships.


The year of grace expired in July last.

The Classing Committee had the case before them on Friday, 8th instant, when they decided to give instructions for the vessel's character to be expunged from the Register Book with a Red Line (9.33), indicating non-compliance with

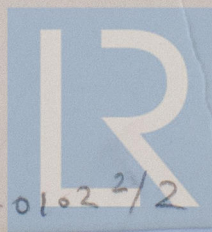
