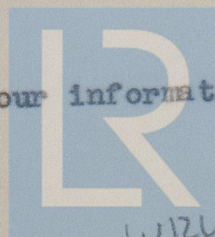
Dear Sirs,

S. With reference to the case of the steamer "SCOTSCRAIG", I have to inform you that the Owner, who appears to have been furnished with a copy of my letter to you of the 8th instant by Messrs. Chas. Barrie & Sons, telephoned this morning to say that he was not prepared to incur any expense in connexion with the certificate for which he had applied, for the vessel to proceed in tow to Rotterdam, and I telegraphed to you immediately as follows:-

"SCOTSCRAIG OWNER REFUSES INCUR ANY EXPENSE SURVEY
"FOR TOWING ROTTERDAM WIRE IMMEDIATELY WHETHER ANY
"SURVEY YET HELD".

Your letter of the 11th instant had not reached this Office until the above telegram had been despatched, and in all the circumstances the case was submitted to the Committee at their meeting today, who gave instructions for the vessel's class to be expunged from the Register Book with a Black Line. I telegraphed you therefore to take no further action with regard to the survey, and have since received your telegram which confirms the statement in your letter of yesterday's date.
