Dear Sir,

I am in receipt of your telegram of to-day's date respecting the steamer "SCOTSCRAIG" reading as follows:-

"FOR YOUR INFORMATION COPY TELEGRAM TO BARRIE FROM OWNERS
"(CHARLES DUNDEE SCOTSCRAIG TRY OBTAIN CERTIFICATE VOYAGE
" SUBJECT EXAMINATION SECOND BOILER BEFORE SAILING IN ANY
" CASE CONFIRM PERMISSION TOW SMITH)"

With regard thereto I have to inform you that if the vessel is to leave under her own steam the previous instructions sent you must be carried out.

If it is to be understood from your telegram now received that the vessel is to be towed from your port, the boiler to be used for the steering engine, windlass and pumps must be examined in accordance with the instructions already sent you.

I would add, however, that, in either event, you must also satisfy yourselves as to the condition of the windlass, steering engine and the necessary pumps.
