Dear Sirs,

With reference to my letter of yesterday's date respecting the steamer "SCOTSCRAIG", I have to inform you that I have this morning received a further communication from the Owner in which he states that he has been able to compromise with the Dundee Harbour Authorities for the time being and has wired this morning to Messrs. Chas. Barrie & Sons requesting you to examine the vessel with a view to the vessel's class being extended to permit of her proceeding from your port to a coaling port in the U.K/Continent and thence to Italy with a non-perishable cargo where, on arrival, it is intended to break her up.

In the circumstances it will be necessary, on your being requested to make an examination, to carry out the inspection in accordance with the terms of Circular No.1605. You must satisfy yourselves, by a careful examination, that the hull, engines and boilers are in a fit condition for the voyage, and be governed strictly by the provisions of this Circular.

I enclose herewith for your information a copy of the letter I have today addressed to the Owner on the matter.
