I have to inform you that the Owner of the steamer "SCOTSCRAIG", which vessel is laid up at your port, has written to say that the Harbour Authorities have given notice of a considerable increase in the rate for laying up, and in consequence he is forced to shift the vessel either to the Forth or Tyne.

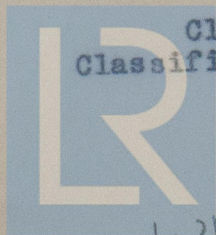
The vessel is to proceed in all probability under tow, and I enclose herewith a copy of the letter which I have today addressed to the Owner, from which you will see that before the vessel leaves it will be necessary for you to satisfy yourselves that she is in a fit condition to do so.

It will be necessary for you to pay special attention to the windlass and steering gear, and also to satisfy yourselves as to the condition of the main boiler which will be used on the passage.
