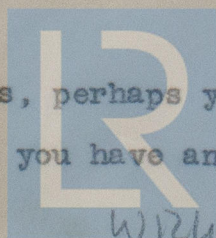

I beg to refer you to my letter of the 23rd August respecting the report which had been received from the Society's Surveyor at Colombo relating to repairs which had been effected by means of welding to the port and centre plates of the port boiler of your steamer "SCOTSCRAIG", the result of which the vessel's class was continued, subject to the main boilers being scaled and cleaned on her arrival at Hong Kong and the engine room tanks scaled and cemented.

In your letter of the 24th August, in acknowledgment, you stated that the matter was duly attended to at Hong Kong when the ship arrived there, but from a letter which has now come to hand from the Society's Surveyors at that port, who have been duly advised of the case, it would appear that no work was requested or carried out there, and on enquiry of the Local Agents the Surveyors were informed that they did not know whether the boilers and engine room tank were scaled and cleaned or not, as no bills were presented to them for work.

In the circumstances, perhaps you will be good enough to let me know whether you have any further information
