Dear Sir,

I beg to acquaint you that the Twin Screw Steamer "ARABIC", No. 08585 in the Register Book, which has been under the Society's survey at Southampton since April last, has sailed for New York, ~~and it is~~ understood that she will trade between New York and Naples.

The vessel has been under survey with a view to classification with this Society, and a First Entry Report has been received from the Society's Surveyors at Southampton, who now report that the following equipment, in addition to that mentioned on their report, is stated to be on board the ship, but could not be verified at their port before the ship sailed, viz:-
