Dear Sirs,

H. With reference to the classification in this Society's Register Book of the tug "HULLMAN" I beg to acquaint you that the Society's Surveyor at Montreal forwarded to this Office your letter of the 9th May intimating that you proposed submitting the screwshaft of this vessel to examination early in June, and that the Committee agreed to this arrangement.

The Society's Surveyor at Montreal now states, however, that he has written to you on several occasions regarding the survey in question but has received no reply to his communications.

The case has received the further consideration of the Committee at their meeting to-day and they desire me to point out that the survey of the screwshaft became due so long ago as April 1930 and to say that arrangements must be made for it to be held without delay in order to entitle the vessel to retain her class.

I shall, therefore, be glad to learn by return mail, for the Committee's information, what steps you

propose taking in the matter.

At the same time I think it well to point out that the Boiler Survey and 2nd Special Survey No.1 of this vessel became due at the end of April and May last respectively, and I shall also be glad to learn what arrangements you propose making to have these inspections carried out.
