Built 1918 - 6. Port: Oslo.

Owners: A/S Tello. Manager: Johannes Lindvig.

Cargo battens not fitted. TS.4,28 (OG).

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The Special Survey No.3 became due on this vessel in
June, 1930, and the Screwshaft survey became due 4,31.

Action in this case has been deferred by the Classing
Committee from time to time.

In May last the Owner requested the postponement of the
survey until November or December next when the vessel's present
charter to Kirkenes would expire. He stated that the vessel was
chartered for these round voyages last Spring and if he had to
stop her the Charterers would certainly cancel the Charter party.

In order to meet the Owner as far as possible the
Classing Committee agreed to give the proposal their favourable
consideration provided the Owner would arrange to have the
vessel drydocked, the underwater parts examined as part of the
Special Survey at an early date, and also to complete the survey
of the machinery at the same time.

The Oslo Surveyors duly advised the Owner of the
Committee's decision who, however, made a further appeal for
the postponement previously desired.

The Classing Committee again had the case before them
on the 12th ultimo but were unable to alter their previous
decision in the matter,

The year of grace expired June, 1931.

A cablegram was received from the Society's Surveyors
at Oslo on the 13th instant stating that the Owner does not wish
the class retained, and the Classing Committee who again had
the case before them on Tuesday, 14th instant, decided to give

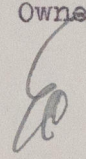

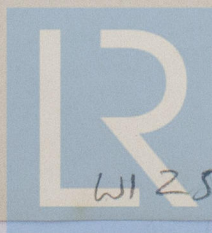
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instructions for the vessel's class to be expunged from the Register Book with a Red Line (7.31), indicating non-compliance with the Rules, and the Surveyors have been requested by cablegram to inform the Owner accordingly.

Since the receipt of the cablegram from the Oslo Surveyors a letter has come to hand from them stating that they had a conference with the Owner on the 11th instant who was very offended because the postponement was not granted and therefore he had not answered their letters. He said that the vessel was now classed with another Society, whose method of managing was more helpful, and due to Lloyd's Register's handling in this case he would not recommend his friends to have their vessels classed by Lloyd's.

We also beg to add that this Owner's influence is very little.
