Dear Sirs:

We are much obliged for your telegram of 5th instant.

S.S. "DIONI" Ship sailed yesterday from Ghent to Emden and we have instructed Messrs. Frachcontor to not load her but try and arrange some certificate of seaworthiness after which we shall cable you definitely how the Insurance will be covered. We cannot understand indeed what difference is existing between Lloyd's Register and Owners. Owners tell to us that they have executed all the repairs fixed by underwriters according to satisfactory certificates being in the hands of the captain and it remains only the drydocking which they have asked to execute in Greece. Lloyd's Register has preferred to cancel the class of the ship and to provoke all this trouble.

Our personal opinion is that the attitude of the Lloyd's Register is a real hostility against the Greek flag and we are very sorry for this thing excepted if there are some other reasons not disclosed to us by owners. We shall not fail to keep you informed regarding the evolution of the business.
