Dear Sir,

Your letter of the 22nd ultimo addressed to the Society's Surveyors at Piraeus respecting the steamer "DIONI" been forwarded to this Office and in view of the fact that state that the vessel has already been fixed for a voyage from Poti to the Continent and thence back to Greece, the case been under the consideration of the Committee to-day, and being that the year of grace allowed for the completion of 3rd Special Survey No.1 expired at the end of August last that it was understood when the vessel was at Bremen in August that you would complete the survey on the vessel's arrival at a home port after she had proceeded from Emden Salonika.

As it now appears that you do not intend to carry out this arrangement and the vessel has been fixed for a further voyage, the Committee consider that the vessel's class must now be expunged from the Register Book with a red line, indicating that through non-compliance with the Society's Rules she is no longer eligible to retain her class. The case will be reported to the General Committee for confirmation at their meeting on Thursday next the 10th instant.
