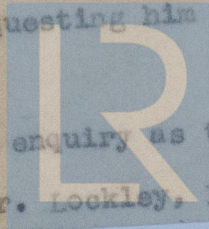

I duly received your letter of the 2nd ultimo enclosing a copy of one from the Secretary to the Government of Madras relative to the survey of the Government dredgers "LORD WILMINGTON", "GOUTHAMI" and "MADRAS" and the tug "KERALA".

In view of the Government's decision to discontinue the existing arrangement regarding the periodical surveys of the "LORD WILMINGTON", "GOUTHAMI" and "KERALA", the Committee have given instructions for the class of each of these vessels to be withdrawn from the Society's Register Book and three dots (...) inserted in lieu thereof.

As regards the dredger "MADRAS", which it is noted the Madras Port Trust are intending to keep in class and have agreed <sup>that</sup> / Mr. Hugh Lockley, an independent engineer at Madras, should carry out the surveys on the Society's behalf, I have to inform you that the Committee will agree to this arrangement and they will be glad if you will furnish Mr. Lockley with all the necessary information requesting him to give the case attention when required.

In reply to your enquiry as to what percentage of should be credited to Mr. Lockley, I may say that it is

thought that the usual fees for surveys in India should be charged for surveys at Madras, and that 50% of the sum should be credited to Mr. Lockley.
