Mr. Prichard representing the managing owners survey the machinery and boilers of the steel screw steamer "FRATZISKA" 5129 tons gross register and No. 58335 in the register Book on the 26th August and subsequent dates while the vessel was lying in the Alexandra Dock.

The following parts were examined:-

The port and starboard main boiler and their mountings—except safety valves—examined throughout and found in good working condition.

The H.P. Cylinder and piston; I.P. valve and chamber; Nos. 2 & 5 main bearings and top brasses. No. 2 tunnel bearing; H.P. crank pin and brasses, and air pump and valves examined and found satisfactory. Other parts of the main and auxiliary machinery examined externally and found in good order.

Judging from my inspection of the parts of the machinery and boilers which have been examined and after reading the reports of the survey held at Leith and Grimsby, I am of opinion that the machinery and boiler appear to be in a fit condition to run for a further period of six months from the date of survey.
