Dear Sirs,

I beg to acquaint you that I have been advised by this Society's Surveyors at Kobe that they have received a letter from you stating that it is no longer your wish to continue the classification of your steamers "LUSHAN MARU" and "SUNGSHAN MARU" in the Society's Register Book.

I may say that the Society's Surveyor at Shanghai has at the same time forwarded a letter which he has received from your Office at that port, from which I regret to learn that, for reasons of economy, you have decided to suspend the classification of all your vessels classed with this and other Societies.

The cases of the two vessels referred to above have been submitted for the consideration of the Committee at their meeting today, and I have to inform you that, in the circumstances, instructions have been given for the character of each vessel to be withdrawn from the Register Book and three dots (...) inserted in lieu thereof, indicating withdrawal of class at Owners' request.
