The Owners' Representatives proceed on board the Japanese Screw steamer "WUGO MARU" of Uraga, No. 76809 in the Register Book, on June 24th. 1921, vessel lying afloat in Hong Kong Harbour, for the purpose of ascertaining whether vessel had sustained any damage stated to have been sustained through vessel striking some unknown submerged object on June 7th. 1921, whilst vessel on voyage from Kobe to Ching Wan Tau.

All double bottom tanks were partially examined internally, and cement was found slightly disturbed on Starboard Side of No. 3 tank.

All bilges in holds and in engine and boiler spaces were examined and found no damage.

As there was no sign of leakage in tanks and bilges, in the opinion of the undersigned, the vessel may proceed on her voyage, and it is recommended that this vessel be drydocked for further examination at Owners' earliest convenience.
