

CABLE

S.S. "BUZI"

The 3rd S.S.No.2 became due in April 1933.

The case is fully stated in endorsement dated 2.11.33, when the Owners were informed that a cablegram had been received from Lloyd's Agents at Beira stating that it had been decided to lay the vessel up permanently and consequently they did not desire her to be surveyed, and that the Committee had given instructions for the class to be withdrawn and three dots inserted in lieu thereof, indicating withdrawal of class at Owners' request.

The following cablegram sent by Lloyd's Agent at Beira to the Corporation of Lloyd's, London, has now been passed on to this Office :-

"PORTUGUESE COASTER BUZI LAID UP FOR LAST THREE MONTHS  
"OWNERS NEGOTIATING SALE MAURITIUS BUYERS SUBJECT TO  
"CERTIFICATE OF SEAWORTHINESS. FULL EXAMINATION MADE  
"EXCEPT BOTTOM BY OUR SURVEYOR TEMPORARY CERTIFICATE OF  
"SEAWORTHINESS VOYAGE MAURITIUS IS BEING ISSUED".

Lloyd's Agents at Beira are aware that the class of this vessel has been withdrawn, and while it would appear that their Surveyor is issuing a certificate in his capacity as a Marine Surveyor, it is submitted that it might be advisable to inform them by cable that as this vessel is no longer classed with this Society no certificate should be issued by their Surveyor on behalf of this Society as a classed vessel.
