Dear Sirs,

With reference to the telephone conversation which I had with you yesterday regarding the case of the S.S. "ATHELCREST", I beg to inform you that following the intimation which had been received from the Society's Surveyors at Greenock that the vessel had proceeded in tow from Lamlash for Rotterdam on Tuesday last, the case was submitted to the Committee at their meeting to-day.

As was pointed out to you, the vessel's class had been allowed to remain undisturbed in the Register Book whilst she was laid up at Lamlash on the understanding that the overdue Second Special Survey No.1 would be held before she proceeded to sea, otherwise the class would be automatically cancelled.

In these circumstances, and as no survey was held on the vessel before she left, the Committee regret that they have had no alternative but to give instructions for the vessel's class to be expunged from
