I wish to acknowledge receipt of your radiogram reading as follows:-

"CABIMAS YOUR LETTER THIRD JULY NO REPORT RECEIVED BY LLOYDS FROM CARTAGENA AGENT MUST THEREFORE EXPUNGE CLASS BUT IF YOU HAVE ANY REASON OTHERWISE PLEASE CABLE".

I have conveyed the contents of this message to the Consulate General of Colombia, who has no further information regarding the survey reported to have been held at Cartagena by Lloyd's Agent. He considers, however, that the Agent at that port should be requested to furnish a copy of the Report stated to have been issued, although, in my opinion, it is very improbable that the full survey requirements have been carried out.

In all the circumstances of the case, I see no reason why the Committee should not expunge the class.
