Dear Sir,

I duly received your memorandum of the 15th ultimo respecting the S.S. "CABIMAS", from which I note that this vessel is still laid up.

As you are aware, the year of grace allowed for the completion of the Special Survey No.2 has now expired, and in the ordinary course the Owners would require to furnish the usual printed form of undertaking.

In view, however, of the letter, dated the 5th December, 1932, which Mr. Kennedy, of the Gulf Refining Company, addressed to you in respect of the case of the S.S. "Monagas", it is not proposed to ask that the undertaking be furnished for the "CABIMAS", the Committee being prepared to accept the letter referred to as covering this case.

In the circumstances, however, the vessel's name will be included on the list of vessels laid up under an undertaking, and I shall be glad if you will be good enough to make it clear to the Owners that the vessel's class has been allowed to remain undisturbed for the present, whilst laid up, on the understanding that the overdue surveys will be carried out before she is again placed in commission.
