Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 28th instant, enclosing one from Mr. Sinnott and Mr. Dimmock respecting the case of the steamer "VISIGOTH", and with regard thereto I shall be glad if the Surveyors will state whether the limbers in the after hold were cemented, and, if so, to what extent the thickness of the cement at the bottom of the limber would alter the level of the same and its drainage tendency at any trim of the vessel, it being observed that the figured dimensions shewn on the Builders' sketch refer only to the intersection of the outer edge of margin plate with the shell plating.

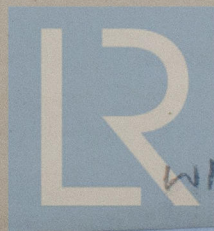
