
I examine on the 22nd March last and subsequent dates while lying off at the Princess Dock Glasgow and at Dumbarton, the vessel Steel S. S. Visigoth of Southampton, in order to ascertain the extent of damage stated to have been sustained while shifting berths at the Princess Dock, Glasgow on the 16th March last.

Upon examination found on port side, on the 5th and 6th strakes under the sheer strake, the lower edge of No 3 plate in one stroke badly set in, and the upper edge of No 3 plate in other stroke also badly set in, just under bold stingers, the said damage in way of same also set in in way of the damaged stingers.

The undersigned recommends

the removal of the plates all stroke plating

and to draw up men to fit out a boat, and to
cause to obtain a full complement of crew, the number of
men of whom to be sent out from the ship to
proceed and complete payment, &c.
after the frames and rudder frames have been
fitted an addition of length of frame of
about five feet be fitted to each of the
frames and all rivets & stiff. to frame and hull
plating, all as pointed out at the time of the
writing in the last letter book of the damage
be carefully looked and make good & repair
the whole of the work be well caulked, the sides
and rudder posts be well coated, and the
rash strengthened to prevent on the rainy &
windy days an efficient condition as it was
before the damage occurred.
