With reference to the laid up fleet in the East, this matter is still under consideration and I hope to have definite information from the Owners whether or not they will sign the usual letter of undertaking at an early date. So far they have not expressed themselves either for or against, but I have hopes that we will be able to come to some arrangement that will meet with the approval of the Committee. I will write you further on this subject just as soon as I get information from the President of the California & Portland Steamship Company.
