Dear Sirs,

S. I beg to refer you to my letter of the 6th September last and to previous correspondence respecting the case of the steamer "STYLIANOS GOUPSODONTIS", which has been laid up at Salonica for some considerable time past in a damaged condition.

I have today received from the Society's Surveyors at Piraeus a cablegram intimating that the vessel is reported to have left Salonica and that no survey has been held by them.

In these circumstances the Committee, to whom the matter was reported at their meeting today, regret that they have had no alternative but to expunge the class from the Register Book with a Black Line, indicating that from reported defects the vessel is no longer eligible to retain her class, and the Piraeus Surveyors have been advised by cablegram to this effect.

It is understood from the telephone conversation which took place with you today that the vessel is to proceed to Italy to be broken up, and if this is so I shall be much obliged if you will kindly confirm this in writing.
