Dear Sirs,

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 31st ultimo in further reference to the steamer "STYLIANOS COUTSODONTIS", which vessel has been laid up at Salonica since September 1932, and have to acquaint you that the case of this vessel received the careful consideration of the Committee at their meeting to-day.

As you are aware the Second Special Survey No.3 became due in March 1931 and extensive repairs are required as recommended by the Society's Surveyor at Gibraltar in July 1932, and in view of the time the vessel has been laid up the Committee regret that they cannot agree to the Owners' proposal for the steamer to proceed as a classed vessel in light condition for the voyage Salonica to Italy without survey.
