Dear Sirs,

With reference to my letter of the 18th August last and to previous correspondence respecting the case of the steamer "STYLIANOS COUTSODONTIS", at present laid up at Salonica, I have to inform you that I am now in receipt of a letter from Messrs. Michalinos & Company, of this City, in which they state they will probably require the vessel to proceed from that port, in ballast, for a repairing port or for a breaking-up port in Italy.

It has been pointed out to Messrs. Michalinos that the Committee can only agree to the vessel making the voyage as a Classed ship, provided a general examination be held on the hull, engines and boilers with a view to your reporting whether she is in a fit condition to undertake the voyage in question.

For this purpose the vessel will be required to be generally examined in accordance with the requirements of Circular No.1605, and I shall be glad if you will cable me, on receipt of this letter, what the fee and expenses would be for such survey.
