Dear Sirs,

I have to inform you that your letter of the 8th instant respecting the case of the steamer "STYLIANOS COUSODONTIS" has been under the consideration of the Committee at their meeting to-day, and after carefully considering your request for the ship to leave Salonica, where she has been laid up for delivery to shipbreakers in Italy without repairs of any kind, the Committee desire me to say that they can only agree to the vessel making the proposed voyage as a classed ship, provided a general examination of the hull, engines and boilers be carried out by the Society's Surveyors, with a view to their reporting whether she is in a fit condition to undertake the voyage in question.

In view of the fact that the vessel has been laid up under an undertaking regarding the very much overdue Second Special Survey No.3, in addition to the examination referred to above the Owners must, when effecting insurance on the hull, inform Underwriters of the above provisions. Prompt advice should also be given to this Office if and when the steamer is sold.
