

Dear Sirs,

With reference to my letter of the 2nd instant relative to the steamer "STYLIANOS COUTSODONTIS", which vessel is laid up at Salonica, and to previous correspondence regarding the general examination which the Committee have asked the Owners to arrange to carry out, I have to inform you that I am in receipt of a further communication from the Society's Surveyors at Piraeus and the case has again been carefully reconsidered, and having regard to the fact that the vessel came under/at Salonica by the Society's Surveyors at Piraeus in September ^{survey} in connexion with the grounding at Europa Point in May of last year, which grounding had also been reported upon by the Society's Surveyor at Gibraltar, and that part of the Second Special Survey No.3 was held at Hamburg in May 1932, when the vessel was examined in dry dock, the Committee have agreed to waive the general examination for the time being.

I shall be glad if you will inform the Owners accordingly, but in the event of the vessel remaining laid up indefinitely it may be necessary to revert to this matter
