Dear Sirs,

With reference to the case of the steamer "STYLIANOS COUTSODONTIS", at present laid up at Salonica, and in the case of which the Second Special Survey No.3 became due so long ago as March, 1931, but has not yet been completed, I have to acquaint you that the Owners' London Agents were recently informed that as two years had elapsed since the Special Survey had become due, and that the vessel was laid up indefinitely, the Committee must ask the Owners to arrange for a general examination of the vessel to be held, in order to entitle her to retain her class.

In reply the Owners' London Agents state they are writing to the Owners in the matter, but would be glad to learn what fees would be charged for the above general examination, and I shall therefore be pleased to learn from you what fees you would suggest and the travelling expenses that would be incurred.

I may perhaps say for your guidance that for a similar examination in this country £3:3:0 would be charged.
